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# General Information

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## Field Setup

Club policy is that if your team game is first to play on the ground that day, it is their responsibility to set up the goals and flags. A quick over the ground also helps to remove rubbish etc. If your team is the last team to play on the ground that day, it is likewise their job to take down the nets and flags and return them packed away to the club house storage area.

Please encourage parents and supporters to assist in these procedures as many hands make like work.

## Technical Areas

Technical Areas for coaches/managers and players are marked at all full fields located at halfway line. Coaches, Managers and reserve players must stay within the confines of their respective Technical Area while the game is in progress. All substitutions/interchanges are to take place from the Technical Area. Coaches of junior teams, up to 16yrs, are permitted to move outside of the Technical Area during the game unless otherwise instructed by the referee.

## Wet Weather

The Secretary will advise either the Coach or Manager of each team of any ground closures, as soon as known. Bear in mind advice may not be received before 7.30am on the weekends, so don't ring with ground enquiries before 8am. Ensure that you have provided the Secretary with the correct phone and mobile number for your team.

If it has rained on Friday or Saturday (for those playing on Saturday) and you haven't been advised of ground closures, **PRESUME THE GAME IS ON**

## Forfeits

If there is a need to forfeit a game, the Coach or Manager must advise the Secretary as soon as possible. Do not wait until Friday night or Saturday morning. Notification is required by Macarthur by Thursday to allow the other club to be advised and Fields will not be fined.

## Goal Posts

Newly Safety and Insurance policies introduced allow NO ONE to swing from goal posts. If you see anyone swinging on goal posts, please let them know to stop immediately. Please ensure prior to your team's game starting that all pegs are securely in the ground and all ties are in place on both goal posts.

During a game in progress, regardless of the age group playing, NO ONE is allowed behind the goal posts or goal line.

## Canteen

The managers will be given a roster of the day/s and times that your teams' parents and supporters will be required to assist in the canteen and on the BBQ. Please advise the canteen supervisor with your volunteers' names and the times they will be attending. Encourage your parents in this vital help to the club- a little extra time at the ground usually allows their children to watch and learn from other games being played as well.

## Match Reports

Match Reports are to be a positive and constructive summary of a team's effort on the day and are to be published in the Club's Website. Ensure that everyone gets a mention in the reports from time to time and use it as a tool to bring up things they might try in the next games. Match Report should be emailed to the publicity officer and not be longer than a good paragraph. You might like to even get your parents, supporters and even the players involved in writing a report from time to time.

## Referee Decisions

The Referee's decision is final. All players are to accept a Referee's rulings. Answering back, verbal outbursts, or obscene gestures or any other type of abuse is not acceptable.

## Cautions and Card Offences

If a player is issued with a Red or Yellow card, the Secretary is to be notified as soon as possible that day after the game. Details of the incident must be recorded on the record sheet provided. Failure to contact the Secretary as soon as possible could lengthen the **applicable suspension period**.

## Registration Cards

Each player must have a Registration Card to play. Unregistered players are not be permitted on the playing surface during the game. The Manager of each team is responsible for the safekeeping of Registration Cards and must ensure that they are available at each game. Managers are to request the opposition team's Registration Cards for checking against the Match Card prior to each game. Every effort should be made to ensure that the opposition team has not fielded any players that are not registered for that Age /Division.

## Match Cards

Only black or blue ball point pens are to be used when filling out match cards. White out or correction fluid is **not** to be used on a match sheets. If a mistake is made and the incorrect name has gone against a shirt number – there is no need to cross out players name and registration details – just cross out the 'shirt number' and change it to the appropriate number. For any other corrections, draw one line through the error and write the correction above.

**Match Sheets must be completed prior to the commencement of the game and handed to the Canteen** The home team is responsible for providing the Match sheet for the game. Additional Match sheet are available from the Canteen. The procedure for completing a Match sheet is:

**Home Team / Visitors:** (home and visitor Club name or abbreviation) we use "Fields United" or "FIE" Alongside the appropriate shirt number record:

**Surname:** (write the players **surname only**; no first names are to be shown or we will be fined).

**Rego. No.** (Write the players **registration number**)

Note:

- If a player is temporarily playing in a higher age or division, the usual age/division must be indicated alongside the player's name.
- Reserve players are to be indicated by (RES) next to the players number in the column provided.
- Stood down or suspended players **surname** and **registration number** must be recorded under Stood down Players.
- If you make an error just place a line through the error and rewrite the information required.

### **At the End of the Game**

The Coach or Manager must check the score entered by the Referee and **must sign the match sheet**. No score will be recorded for U6/U7's. Please ensure that you collect the copy of the match sheet for away games and return them to the canteen with the referee receipt

## Injuries

All injuries sustained by players during a game are to be recorded and reported by the Coach or Manager to the Secretary on the day of occurrence. At home games advise a Ground Official or the Canteen Supervisor to record the details in the injury book. Please note-there is no extra time added to the clock due to injuries.

## Lightning Precautions

If there is lightning /storm activity whilst players are on the field (either at training ora matches) precautions must be taken to ensure everyone's safety. If you are directed to leave the ground by either the referees, ground officials or an appointed representative of the club, please do so immediately. Take cover within buildings or under roofs etc

If training use the "30second rule". If you sight lightning, count until you hear thunder.If that period is less than or equal to 30 seconds the storm isles than 10km away, and everyone is to leave the ground immediately and seek shelter. Please ensure that you account for everybody once shelter has been found and taken

## Consumption of Alcohol & Smoking

Blinman Park is an Alcohol Free Zone and as such, consumption of Alcohol is not permitted at any time. This is by council regulation and prosecutions are likely. In promotion of the good health to children, please refrain from smoking whilst at the ground. The area immediately around the clubhouse is Smoke Free Zone.

Consumption of alcohol is only permitted within a designated area at each ground. Please check where the designated area is before consuming any alcohol.

## Meetings

General Meetings are held on the first Tuesday of each month and need to be attended by at least one representative from the team-be it coach, manager or on the seniors case a player. Please also encourage parents to attend as well. We are always on the look out for good ideas and input.

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# Codes of Conduct

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These codes of conduct have been developed as a guide for players, parents, coaches and managers so that the experience at Fields United can be an enjoyable and rewarding time.

The information used in these codes comes from the Australian Sports Commission and the Macarthur District Soccer Football Association Inc. The information contained in this document explains the conduct that is required of players, parents, coaches and managers as well as their duties and responsibilities while part of Fields United Soccer Club Inc. It also contains information on what to do when assistance is required or a dispute or concern arises.

## Players

- I will always play by the rules
- I will never argue with an official. If I disagree with the decision, I will inform the captain, coach, manager or team committee during a break or after the competition.
- I will control my temper. I understand that verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players and deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviour in any sport
- I will work equally hard for myself and/or my team
- I will be a good sport and applaud all good players whether they are made by my team or the opposition
- I treat all players in my sport as I like to be treated. I will not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor
- I will cooperate with my coach, team mates and opponent
- I will display modesty in victory and graciousness in defeat
- I will participate for my own enjoyment and benefit, and not just to please parents and coaches.
- I will not arrive at the venue intoxicated or drink alcohol at junior matches
- I will respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion
- I will thank the opposition and officials at the end of the game.
- I will comply with anti-doping policy

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## Coach

- I will remember that players participate for enjoyment and winning is only part of the fun
- I will never ridicule or yell at players for making a mistake or not winning
- I will be reasonable in my demands on players' time, energy and enthusiasm.
- I will operate within the rules and spirit of the game and teach my players to do the same
- I will ensure that the time players spend with me is a positive experience. All players are deserving of equal attention and opportunities
- I will avoid overplaying the talented players and understand that the average players need and deserve equal time
- I will not use bad language nor will I harass players, officials, spectators or other coaches.
- I will ensure equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate for the age and ability of all players
- I will display control respect and professionalism to all involved with the sport, including opponents, referees, coaches, officials, administrators, the media, parents and spectators. I will encourage my players to the same.
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# Mini Rules

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The following are extracts from MDSFA Rules and By-Laws (as amended at SGM 1/03/04).

## Rule 26.1 - MINI SOCCER RULES FOR UNDER 6 & UNDER 7

### Pitch Measurements

GOALS:	1.5m high x 4.5m wide
GOAL AREA:	10m radius semi-circle
CENTRE CIRCLE:	5m radius circle drawn.
CORNER AREAS:	1m radius from centre. Flags on posts must be placed at each corner.
FIELD SIZE:	Length 60m maximum - 45m minimum      Width 45m maximum - 30 minimum
THE BALL:	Size 3

### Duration of Games

Under 6	15 minutes each way, 5 minutes half time
Under 7	20 minutes each way, 5 minutes half time

### Players

- (a) Games will be conducted between teams on a maximum of 6 and a minimum of 4 players.
- (b) There will be no restrictions in the number of substitutes allowable.
- (c) Each team must have a goalkeeper dressed in colours that distinguish him from all other players.

### The Playing Rules – Under 6 & 7

Games shall be played according to the FIFA Laws of Association Football with the following modifications:

1. Games will be conducted as friendly games. Competition Points and tables **will not** apply.
2. Goal kicks will be taken from the centre of the arc defining the goal area.
3. Corner kicks will be taken from the corner area.
4. All free kicks will be indirect free kicks.
5. All free kicks awarded inside the goal area (i.e. for both teams) will be taken with the ball placed on the arc defining the goal area at the point nearest the position of the offence.
6. Defending players must be no less than 5m from the ball during the taking of any free kick, corner kick or goal kick.
7. The offside law shall not apply.
8. Players marking or obstructing the opposing goalkeeper, whilst that goalkeeper is in control of the ball, will be penalised by an indirect free kick taken from the centre of the arc defining the goal area. Once the goalkeeper has controlled the ball all defending and attacking players shall be outside the goal area OR five metres from the ball which ever is the greatest. Once having control of the ball the keeper may place the ball on the ground to kick out of the goal area. The ball shall not be deemed in play until it has crossed the arc defining the goal area.
9. Players may be interchanged at any time during the match.
10. No coaching will be allowed from the sideline.
11. Coaches will be permitted on the field, but must remain outside of the goal area.
12. The “pass back to the goal keeper” rule will not apply in mini soccer.

## **RULE: 27.1 - MINI SOCCER RULES FOR UNDER 8**

### **Pitch Measurements**

GOALS:	1.5m high x 4.5m wide
GOAL AREA:	10m radius semi-circle
CENTRE CIRCLE:	5m radius circle drawn.
CORNER AREAS:	1m radius from centre. Flags on posts must be placed at each corner.
FIELD SIZE:	Length 75m maximum - 66m minimum    Width 55m maximum - 40m minimum
THE BALL:	Size 3

### **Duration of Games**

Under 8                      20 minutes each way, 5 minutes half time

### **Players**

- (a) Games will be conducted between teams of a maximum of 9 and a minimum of 7 players.
- (b) There will be no restrictions in the number of substitutes allowable.
- (c) Each team must have a goalkeeper dressed in colours that distinguish him from all other players.

### **The Playing Rules**

Games shall be played according to the FIFA Laws of Association Football with the following modifications.

1. Games will be conducted as friendly games. Competition points and tables will not apply.
2. Goal kicks will be taken from the centre of the arc defining the goal area.
3. Corner kicks will be taken from the corner area.
4. There will be no PENALTY KICKS.
5. All free kicks awarded inside the goal area (i.e. for both teams) will be taken with the ball placed on the arc defining the goal area at the point nearest the position of the offence.
6. Defending players must be no less than 5m from the ball during the taking of any free kick, corner kick or goal kick.
7. The offside law shall apply as F.I.F.A. Laws of the game.
8. Players marking or obstructing the opposing goalkeeper, whilst that goalkeeper is in control of the ball, will be penalised by an indirect free kick taken from the centre of the arc defining the goal area.
9. Players may be interchanged at any time during the match.
10. No coaching will be allowed from the sideline in under 8's except by the Coach and then only if information is given quietly in a NON HYSTERICAL manner.
11. Coaches will not be permitted on the field.
12. The "pass back to the goal keeper" rule will not apply in mini soccer.
